- What should I do if somebody attempts to buy a solvent or substance for another person's use, who I believe may abuse the product?*
  - Make the sale
  - Refuse the sale
  - Make the sale but inform the customer you will only sell it this once
- A young person has explained that s/he wants adhesive to build a model. You have no reason to believe the person will not use the product for its intended use. What age person can buy the product?*
  - Anyone. However, we advise you to apply a voluntary 18 year old rule to such products
  - 12
  - 21
- Hairspray, body spray and deodorants contain substances that can intoxicate if abused. Does an age restriction apply to these goods?*
  - Yes, young people should get their parents to buy these products for them
  - In general no, but you must be aware that if a young person wants an unusual quantity they should be challenged with a serious view for refusal
  - No, it's important that young people look and smell good
- Which of the following products would you express concerns about selling to a person under the legal age limit?*
  - A container of body spray
  - 10 containers of adhesive
  - A bottle of nail varnish
