Happy New Year!

The last three months have, as always, been a busy time for the Town Council. My colleague Ross has his own article explaining all the wonderful projects we have been working on.

In addition to this the Town Council has:

- been planning the 2024/25 budget over the last few months and a draft budget will be considered by Full Council on 10th January.
- pledged £60,000 to support Shoalstone Pool's "Save Shoalstone from the Waves" project. The pledge is subject to Shoalstone Seawater Pool CIO raising sufficient funds to carry out the project. At the time of writing, we were waiting for Torbay Council to consider a similar financial request on 7th December before a joint press release is issued.



met with a representative from the Department for Levelling up, Housing and Communities to discuss the priorities for Brixham within Torbay's Levelling up Partnership. Both Cllr Roseveare and I used this opportunity to highlight the Town's priority of a Town Centre Regeneration which included improved central parking facilities and a flexible public realm space. Whilst we recognise the need for the expansion of the fish quay, given that a large quantity of fish is transported by road into the town, we emphasised that Brixham does not have the road network to support this expansion. Brixham is historically a fishing port and long may this continue. However, it is also more than that now, it is a place to visit, live and work. Therefore, we believe there is a need for investment in the town that is outside of the fishing industry.

As we close the door to 2023 and look to 2024, I would like to say thank you to Torbay Ward Councillors for attending and engaging with the Town Council. We were also delighted to welcome Cllr Thomas and Mrs Bond, Leader and Chief Executive Officer of Torbay to the Town Council meeting back in November.

I am pleased to report that the frustrations the Town Council had prior to the May elections have somewhat been alleviated thanks to both Councils commitment to improving its engagement with each other.

I hope you all have a prosperous and happy 2024.

Friends of St Marys Park - Higher Brixham

We have had an exciting year in our park. In early spring we held a tree identification event with our local Tree Warden and surprisingly identified 56 of the most major trees throughout the park.

Late Spring saw the completion of 3 new raised planters and seating area which is being well used. All the shrubs and plants used to fill the planters are grown locally by our group or from a nursery at Preston. In mid-July we were judged in the Royal Horticultural Society "It's Your Neighbourhood Awards" and retained Outstanding for the 5th year running.

On the same day came the results for the Green Flag Awards of which we passed. This is awarded jointly by the Department for Levelling up and Keep Britain Tidy due to the Friends Group working jointly in partnership with Swisco. With recycled bulbs from Swisco flower beds 2023 we have now planted around 400 tulips in the Bluebell wood on the entry to the park to extend the early spring displays and recently we received and planted a second donation of crocuses from the Brixham Rotary in their efforts to rid the country of Polio.

Finally after the group held conversations with a Brixham Town Councillor we are very pleased to see Christmas lights hanging once again in St Mary's Square.

Gardening Assistance Scheme

Another year has passed and another year for our lengthsmen to help the residents of Brixham with their gardens. The weather was (mostly) on our side in 2023 and allowed us to provide this valuable service to 120 households providing 562 hours of gardening over a period of 113 days! In 2024 we are continuing the service to residents of Brixham who are

- **Residents aged 70 or over.** You must have no other person living in the property under the age of 70.
- **Residents with a disability.** You must have no other able-bodied person living in the property under the age of 70.
- You do not already employ a gardener

If you think you may qualify and would like some help with your garden, complete one of our application forms and return to our office. The forms can be found on our website and are available from our reception on the first floor of the Town Hall in New Road (9am-3pm).

Brixham Rugby Club - 150 Years of Rugby in the Town

Brixham RFC is a community sports club, proud of its history and reputation in the town that goes back to 1875. From the early part of the 20th century, rugby has been played at Astley Park on a ground that was bought by two stalwarts and given to Torbay Council with the stipulation that all the time rugby is played on the ground that they would have exclusive use in perpetuity which it continues to enjoy this privilege today. In addition to this, Torbay Council has recently granted a rolling 150 year lease, which is all but the same as the Freehold.

The numbers that play at the club and the size of the membership now are very different to those very early days. The club currently have 14 youth teams, Colts and 4 senior teams that will regularly turn out over a weekend. The Club is close to many people's hearts, in some cases a way of life. Thousands of past players have worn the Brixham shirt with passion and pride and benefitted from camaraderie and playing experiences over the years.

At the start of the **2024/25** season, rugby will have been played in the town for 150 continuous years. The club is in the heart of Brixham in terms of location and its place in the town's history and plans are being put in place to mark the Club's 150th Anniversary to celebrate this historic year. Club Chairman Chris Forster "We are very proud of reaching this landmark and want this achievement to leave a long-term legacy". We want as many people in the club and the community to be involved in our celebrations as possible.

This is the mission upon which Brixham RFC have embarked as the club launches a series of events to mark its 1875 founding.

Battery Gardens Volunteers

The group was formed in the Spring of 2022 with the intention of restoring the gardens to their former glory for the benefit of the local community and visitors alike after years of neglect. So far we have been able to restore the stunning views of the bay from the covered shelter by removing the brambles and some of the self-set buddleia bushes which had grown unchecked, whilst being mindful of the needs of the prolific wildlife that we are fortunate to have. There are rabbits, squirrels and numerous species of birds ranging from tiny wrens and fire crests up to the large buzzards.



We have built bug houses, installed a hedgehog house, renovated benches, sown pollinator flowers, planted hundreds of spring bulbs and maintained and improved pathways. We are in the process of preparing a memorial remembrance rose bed which will be planted out in the spring. This is all part of our plan to restore the gardens to a family and community friendly place.

We are a small, friendly, informal group who meet each Friday (weather permitting) at about 9.45am until about 12 noon. We would welcome new volunteers to come and join us. Tools are provided. You don't need to be a gardening expert, just friendly and enthusiastic and enjoy getting out into the fresh air. We have come a long way but there is still a lot to do. Come down and see us and have a chat and maybe join in. It is quite satisfying to see people of all ages coming to and enjoying this beautiful area just a stone's throw from the harbour.

Walking Football

Brixham Town 'GeriHatricks' Walking Football group provides a fun way for anyone over 50 to improve their physical and mental wellbeing. Our ages range from 55 to 83. It's an inclusive and accessible way to get active for people who may feel that they may not be fit or mobile enough. The benefits of walking football are well documented. It helps build strength and endurance and the low impact nature of the sport means that it's suitable for people with osteoarthritis and joint problems. It's also perfect if you have a heart condition and want to maintain an active lifestyle and optimum mobility as you get older.

Brixham Time & Tide Bell

The Brixham Time and Tide Bell is one of 13 bells located around the coast and tidal waters of Britain and is designed to be rung by the motion of the waves at high tide. The bell has a unique design that produces a gentle musical sound that varies according to the differing wave patterns.

The timber frame supporting the bell was made from a single oak tree planted in Devon in 1790 and felled in 2021, thus capturing carbon from the industrial revolution through to present day. The Brixham bell steel structure was made by a local Brixham engineering firm, RWS engineering and the oak fashioned by a Brixham joiner, Kings Joinery.

The Time and Tide Bell project was created by Devon based artist, Marcus Vergette, and seeks to remind us of our strong relationship with the land and sea, and importantly for us, the Brixham fishing community's reliance on the sea and also how bells have been used for centuries to celebrate, summon and warn local communities.

This bell installation aims to stimulate thought, discussion and action, whether to remind us of the threat of rising sea levels, coastal erosion or simply to contemplate the nature of time and our place within it.

The other Time and Tide Bells all uniquely represent their communities and locations. These are Aberdyfi (Gwynedd), Appledore (Devon), Bosta Bay (Isle Of Lewis), Camaes Bay (Anglesey), Happisburgh (Norfolk), Harwich (Essex), London (Trinity Buoy Wharf), Mablethorpe (Lincolnshire), Morecombe (Lancashire), Par (Cornwall), Redcar (Yorkshire) and Ventnor (Isle Of Wight).


